1. What is open burning?

The burning of material in the open air without the smoke first passing through a stack or chimney.

2. Name 2 ways people can open burn.

grass fires, burn barrels, campfires, piles.

3. Open burning is the largest known source of dioxin emissions, according to the US Environmental Protection Agency.

4. List 3 items that are illegal to open burn.

plastic, wet rubbish, batteries, oily substances, asphalt, rubber, treated or painted wood, etc.

5. List 2 items that are legal to burn (unless prohibited by local ordinance).

clean untreated unpainted wood, dry leaves and brush, non-recyclable paper, cardboard.

6. The Department of Natural Resources estimates that there are 500,000 burn barrels in Wisconsin alone.

7. In the 1970's this act helped clean up polluters in the US.

8. Dioxin is formed when trash items containing carbon and chlorine are burned.

12. Why is tilling ash from open burning bad?
It contains toxic chemicals - arsenic, cadmium, chromium, barium, lead, and mercury – that can end up in the wrong places.
13. Each year open burning causes 1/3 of all wild fires in Wisconsin.

plastic containers, newspaper, cardboard, waste oil, tires, etc.

landfill, recycle, compost, mulch, waste reduction
